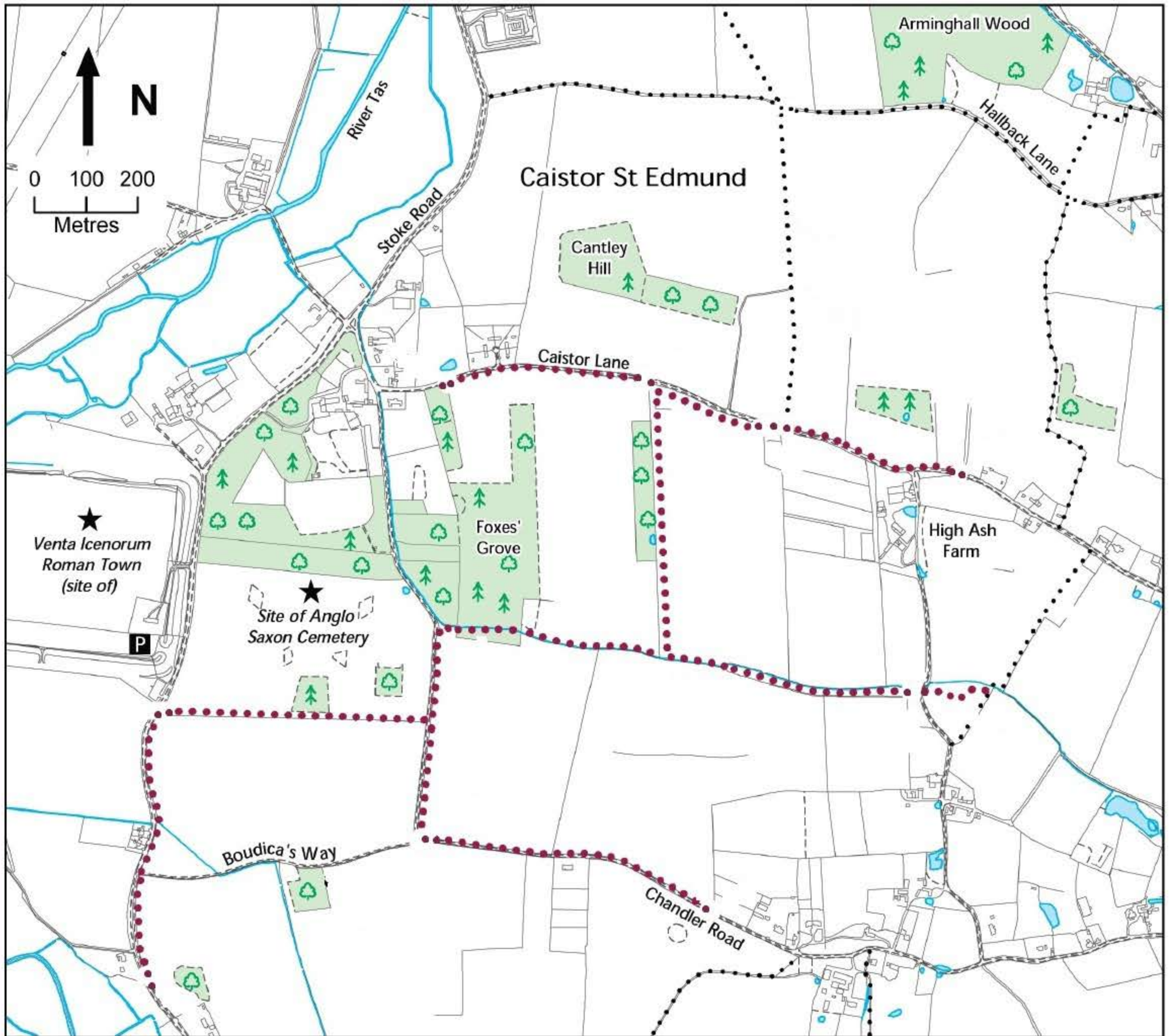


PERMISSIVE ACCESS

From the permissive footpaths on High Ash Farm you will see conservation work including seed plots for birds, hedge planting and new woodlands. The path runs close to an early Saxon cemetery site and settlements associated with Caistor Roman town. Please stay on designated paths and keep dogs on leads at all times to avoid disturbing wildlife.

Be aware that horses may be using the adjacent private bridleways.
